FINAL ORDER RESCINDING FINE

This matter came before the Commission on Ethics (Commission), on its own motion, meeting in public session on April 22, 2022, on appeal of the Appellant, pursuant to Section 112.3145(8)(g), Florida Statutes, which assesses an automatic fine of \$25 per day on a person who fails to timely file a required CE Form 1, Statement of Financial Interests. The Commission may, on its own motion, waive the fine in whole or in part for good cause shown, based on "unusual circumstances" surrounding the failure to file by the designated date. There are no matters in dispute. Appellant did not request a hearing before the Commission.

Findings of Fact

- 1. According to information provided to the Commission, the Appellant serves or had served as a member of the Planning and Zoning Board for the city of Groveland, Florida, a position requiring the filing of a CE Form 1, "Statement of Financial Interests," for the year 2018. In 2019, the designated due date for submitting a 2018 CE Form 1 annual filing was July 1, 2019, with a grace period ending on September 3, 2019.
- 2. No later than June 1, 2019, the Supervisor of Elections of Lake County (SOE) sent to the Appellant a blank 2018 CE Form 1. The blank 2019 CE Form 1 was mailed to the Appellant at 1172 Greenley Avenue, Groveland, Florida 34736 (Greenley Avenue address). However, the

Appellant had moved from that address and relocated to 1131 Stratton Avenue, Groveland, Florida 34756 (Stratton Avenue address). On June 24, 2019, the SOE re-mailed the blank form to the Appellant's Stratton Avenue address.

- 3. No later than July 31, 2019, the SOE sent to the Appellant a notice of delinquency via certified mail to remind her of her obligation to file a 2018 CE Form 1. This notice was mailed to the Appellant at the Stratton Avenue address.
- 4. On August 19, 2019, the Commission also sent to the Appellant a postcard intended to remind her of her obligation to file a 2018 CE Form 1. This postcard was mailed to the Greenley Avenue address.
- 5. On September 6, 2019, the Commission sent a courtesy notice to the Appellant indicating that fines were beginning to accrue. This notice was sent to the Appellant's Greenley Address.
- 6. As of November 2, 2019, the Appellant had not filed her 2018 CE Form 1 within 60 days of the grace period date and had, therefore, incurred the maximum fine amount of \$1,500.
- 7. On March 10, 2020, the Commission sent to the Appellant a Notice of Assessment of Automatic Fine via certified mail. The notice was sent to the Appellant's Greenley Address. It indicated the total of the Appellant's accrued automatic fine, and included a notice of the right to appeal the fine, stating that the appeal had to be received by the Commission by April 9, 2020, to be considered timely.
- 8. On June 11, 2021, the Commission sent to the Appellant the second and final Notice of Assessment of Automatic Fine. This notice was sent to the Appellant's Stratton Avenue address. This notice informed the Appellant that if she did not pay the assessed fine by July 12,

- 2021, the Commission will enter a Default Final Order against the Appellant for failure to file her 2018 CE Form 1. The Appellant did not file her 2018 CE Form 1 by July 12, 2021.
- 9. On September 15, 2021, a Default Final Order was entered upon against the Appellant. Pursuant to the Default Final Order, the Appellant had thirty (30) days from the date of the Default Order (October 18, 2021) to pay the \$1,500 fine to the Commission whereafter non-payment would result in collection proceedings. A notification of issuance of default final order including a copy of the default order was mailed to the Appellant's Stratton Avenue address.
- 10. On February 1, 2022, the Appellant submitted her 2018 CE Form 1 to the Commission and the Commission accepted the form on behalf of the SOE. On the same day, the Appellant updated her address to 1824 Wilson Prairie Circle, Groveland, Florida 34736.
- 11. On February 7, 2022, the Appellant spoke with Commission staff over the telephone and submitted her Appeal of the Automatic Fine for Form Year 2018 to the Commission via email. In part B of the appeal form, the Appellant checked "Lack of Notification Failure to receive notice" and "Claim of timely filing of financial disclosure" as the reasons for her appeal. In part C of the appeal form, where the Appellant is asked to provide a detailed explanation of her appeal including why the options they selected in part B of their form are applicable to their situation, the Appellant does not explain her claim for timely filing of her financial disclosure; however, the Appellant states that she never received a timely notification of her form filings because she was longer living at the Greenley Avenue or the Stratton Avenue address. The Appellant further provided a sworn notarized statement stating that her mail was delayed during her stay at the Stratton Avenue address and she did contact the SOE Office as early as she received the mail notification of the fine. The Appellant further explains that she had been severely ill and was hospitalized for months during her filing and fine accrual period. The Appellant further states

in her sworn statement that upon recovery from illness and discharge from hospital, she moved out of state for a family related emergency and was rendered homeless upon her return to Florida. Thereafter, the Appellant was forced to acquire a new residence for which she has updated her address with the Commission and the SOE. The Appellant did not request a hearing.

Conclusions of Law

- 16. The Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this proceeding pursuant to Section 112.3145, Florida Statutes.
- 17. Financial disclosure is required of public officials and employees because it enables the public to evaluate potential conflicts of interest, deters corruption, and increases public confidence in government.
 - 18. Section 112.3145(8)(g)3., Florida Statutes, states:

Any reporting person may appeal or dispute a fine, based upon unusual circumstances surrounding the failure to file on the designated due date, and may request and is entitled to a hearing before the commission, which may waive the fine in whole or in part for good cause shown. Any such request must be in writing and received by the commission within 30 days after the notice of payment due is transmitted. In such a case, the reporting person must, within the 30-day period, notify the person designated to review the timeliness of reports in writing of his or her intention to bring the matter before the commission. For purposes of this subparagraph, the term "unusual circumstances" does not include the failure to monitor an e-mail account or failure to receive notice if the person has not notified the commission of a change in his or her e-mail address.

Conclusions of Law

19. The Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this proceeding pursuant to Section 112.3145, Florida Statutes.

- 20. Financial disclosure is required of public officials and employees because it enables the public to evaluate potential conflicts of interest, deters corruption, and increases public confidence in government.
 - 21. Section 112.3145(8)(g)3., Florida Statutes, states:

Any reporting person may appeal or dispute a fine, based upon unusual circumstances surrounding the failure to file on the designated due date, and may request and is entitled to a hearing before the commission, which may waive the fine in whole or in part for good cause shown. Any such request must be in writing and received by the commission within 30 days after the notice of payment due is transmitted. In such a case, the reporting person must, within the 30-day period, notify the person designated to review the timeliness of reports in writing of his or her intention to bring the matter before the commission. For purposes of this subparagraph, the term "unusual circumstances" does not include the failure to monitor an e-mail account or failure to receive notice if the person has not notified the commission of a change in his or her e-mail address.

- 22. Appellant was notified of her appellate rights by notice on March 10, 2020, and informed that her appeal needed to be received by the Commission on or before April 9, 2020, in accordance with the 30-day appeal period allowed by Section 112.3145(8)(g)3., Florida Statutes. Appellant did not timely file an appeal. Appellant then filed her appeal on February 7, 2022, which was outside the 30-day window.
- 23. "An elementary and fundamental requirement of due process in any proceeding which is to be accorded finality is notice reasonably calculated, under all the circumstances, to apprise interested parties of the pendency of the action and to afford them an opportunity to present their objections." <u>Mullane v. Cent. Hanover Bank</u>, 339 U.S. 306, 314(1950).
- 24. Appellant was provided notice of her appellate rights and of her opportunity to be heard, and did not timely file an appeal. However, her notice of appellate rights were likely mailed to a wrong address and were not received by her in due time. Considering the coincidence of the

30-day appeal period with lack of notification delivery, and the complications caused by the Appellant's illness, her hospitalization thereafter, her losing her primary residence upon recovery, and her consequential relocation to a new residence, her appeal is accepted as timely filed.

25. Turning to the merits of Appellant's appeal, her basis for appealing the fine is that she did not timely receive the mail containing the notification for filing the 2018 Form 1 and the Assessment Notice thereafter. There is no evidence to conclusively refute the Appellant's claim. On the contrary, the Appellant's sworn notarized statement states that she did not timely receive the mailings. The Appellant's sworn statement coupled with the complications caused by the Appellant's illness, her hospitalization thereafter, her losing her primary residence upon recovery, and her consequential relocation to a new residence, constitute "unusual circumstances" that justify waiving the \$1,500 fine.

<u>Order</u>

Based on the foregoing facts and conclusions of law, the Commission hereby rescinds the Default Final Order entered on September 15, 2021, and waives the assessed fine of \$1,500.

I didn't start receiving mail at that address for about 11 month due to a delay in mail(I guess due to Covid). I'm not for sure when I received your letter but I know once I received that mail I panicked and called the Supervisor of elections and spoke to Daniella at 3522531436, as well as sent her an email with the information she asked for at the time. She informed me that I need to speak to Kim in Tallahassee about removing the fines. Two days later I was hospitalized.

I was hospitalized off and on for about 3 months and was to ill to truly remember that I was supposed to call Ms Kim. I hate to say that it got worse I lost my sister in Texas and had to go there to help my family for a couple of months because my mother is 80 years old and could not handle those funeral arrangements alone. Once I returned my entire world was turned upside down. I was moving looking for a place to stay again and unfortunately ended up homeless.

Thankfully I am now in a stable residence and my life is back on track. I am still struggling with a bit of illness in my body but nothing that I cant manage now. I am asking you all to please understand that to come up with that type of money now for fines that I knew nothing about and was dealing with so many personal issues to resolve this one. I would be homeless again to try to come up with that amont of money. Festivals are beginning to start again so my seasoning company business is doing ok but not to the point to be able to pay this fine. If this means that I have to resign from my seat on the counsil board of Plan and Zoning of Groveland I will but I truly don't want to do that just because I didn't get the mail in time and my illness. Thank you and I look forward to hearing from you.

Dear Ms. Stewart:

The Commission on Ethics (Commission) is in receipt of your Appeal of Automatic Fine for Form Year 2018, filed with the Commission on Ethics on February 1, 2022.

As you know, your 2018 CE Form 1, Statement of Financial Interest, was due by July 1, 2019, with a penalty-free filing grace period extending the due date to September 3, 2019. However, you failed to file your 2018 CE Form 1, and as of November 2, 2019, you had incurred the maximum fine for \$1,500. On March 10, 2020, the Commission sent you a Notice of Assessment of Automatic Fine stating that you may appeal the fine pursuant to Section 112.3145(8)(g)3, Florida Statutes, and Rule 34-8.215, Florida Administrative Code. The notice further stated that your appeal must be received on or before April 9, 2020. However, your appeal was received on February 1, 2022 – approximately 21 months past the April 9, 2020 deadline. Please provide me with the following information, preferably in a sworn notarized statement:

Please explain in greater detail why you were not able to timely file an appeal of your fine with the Commission on or before the April 9, 2020 deadline.

During the Commission's investigation of Complaint No. 21-194, you stated to a Commission Investigator that you mistakenly filed an appeal for the automatic fine with the Lake County Supervisor of Elections' (SOE) Office. If possible, please provide a copy of that appeal.

Additionally, in your appeal form filed on February 1, 2022 with the Commission, you checked "Lack of notification – Failure to receive notice" and "Claim of timely filing financial disclosure" as the reasons underlying your appeal. In Part C of your appeal, you explained – "I was no longer at the address listed of 1172 Greenley Ave., I moved to 1131 Stratton Ave. and didn't receive notification until a year later." As to the "Lack of notification – Failure to receive notice," and your statement quoted above, please explain in greater detail the reasons that you did not receive notice regarding the filing obligation associated with your 2018 CE Form 1.

During the investigation, you stated to a Commission Investigator that you did email a copy of your 2018 CE Form 1 to the SOE Office following your conversation with the SOE staff in June of 2021. As to this "Claim of timely filing of financial disclosure," please provide an explanation, preferably in a sworn notarized statement, that supports your assertion that you did timely file the 2018 Form 1 financial disclosure after being notified by the SOE staff.

Please provide me with the above-referenced information within two weeks of the date of this correspondence. If the information is not received within two weeks of the date of this letter, this matter will be handled using the information initially provided. If you have any questions as to the documentation sought, please do not hesitate to contact me. I will be happy to help you.

NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT OF AUTOMATIC FINE

The Commission on Ethics hereby gives notice of an assessment of a fine against you pursuant to Section 112.3145(8)(g), Florida Statutes, due to your failure to timely file your 2018 CE Form 1, Statement Of Financial Interests. Under the law, your 2018 CE Form 1, Statement of Financial Interests, was due by July 1, 2019. The law provided for a penalty-free grace period extending the due date to September 3, 2019. After that date, you accrued fines of \$25.00 per day for each day your financial disclosure was late, up to the maximum fine of \$1,500.00 (60 days late), pursuant to Section 112.3145(8)(g), Florida Statutes.

Inasmuch as your 2018 CE Form 1 has not been filed with the Supervisor of Elections for Lake County within the 60 days of the grace period date (September 3, 2019), you have accrued the maximum fine amount of \$1,500.00. This fine must be paid to the Commission on Ethics within 30 days of the date of this notice unless you appeal the fine to the Commission. The Commission has the authority to consider the appeal and waive the fine in whole or in part if your failure to file on time was due to "unusual circumstances" surrounding the failure to file. Unless the fine is successfully appealed, the Commission is required to investigate public officers and employees who receive the maximum \$1,500 fine, to determine whether their failure to file was willful. The penalty for willfully failing to file disclosure is removal from public office or employment.

HOW TO APPEAL

- 1. Read these instructions carefully before submitting your appeal.
- 2. **LEGAL AUTHORITY:** Appeals are governed by Section 112.3145(8)(g)3, Florida Statutes, and Commission Rule 34-8.215, Florida Administrative Code.
- 3. **FORMAT:** Your appeal must be in writing and mailed to Florida Commission on Ethics, P. O. Drawer 15709, Tallahassee, FL 32317-5709, or delivered to Florida Commission on Ethics, 325 John Knox Road, Building E, Suite 200, Tallahassee, FL 32303. The appeal may take the form of a letter or you may use the appeal form included in this mailing. The appeal form also is available at the Commission's website: www.ethics.state.fl.us. Click on "Financial Disclosure" and then the link to the sample appeal form.
- 4. **DUE DATE:** Your appeal must be <u>received</u> by the Commission on Ethics on or before <u>April 9, 2020</u>. <u>NOTE</u>: Failure to timely file an appeal will constitute a waiver of your right to appeal and will result in the entry of a default order against you.
- 5. UNUSUAL CIRCUMSTANCES: An appeal must demonstrate that you submitted your CE Form 1 after the extended due date because of "unusual circumstances." "Unusual circumstances" is defined in Commission Rule 34-8.215(4), Florida Administrative Code, as "uncommon, rare, or sudden events over which the reporting individual had no control and which directly result in the failure to act in accordance with the filing requirements." Therefore, circumstances that allowed for time to take steps necessary to file on time do not constitute "unusual circumstances" that will allow the Commission to waive the fine. You have the burden to establish "unusual circumstances." Your appeal must specifically state the circumstances that led to your not filing by September 3, 2019, and must include any documentation or evidence supporting your appeal, such as:
 - a. SICKNESS/INJURY: a statement from attending physician, including dates and nature of the illness or injury;
 - b. LACK OF NOTICE (WRONG ADDRESS): documentation that you did not reside at the address to which notice was sent;

- c. LACK OF NOTICE (ABSENCE FROM HOME): documentation establishing the period of time of your absence covering the notification period;
- d. CLAIM OF TIMELY FILING OF FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE: (1) an affidavit from you attesting under oath or affirmation that you filed your financial disclosure and your recollection of when and how you filed and (2) a copy of a certified mail receipt and/or a copy of the completed form which was filed. If you have witnesses to your filing, we also will need an affidavit from each witness. NOTE: A claim of having filed the CE Form 1F for the current year does not satisfy the CE Form 1 filing requirement or excuse a late filing;
- e. LEFT PUBLIC POSITION BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2018: confirmation of your last date of office or employment by your former agency, showing the last date to be before December 31, 2018; or
- f. UNCLAIMED CERTIFIED MAIL: if deliquency notice was addressed correctly but not received, you must explain why.
- 6. YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING: You have the right to have your appeal heard by the Commission and to appear before the Commission at the hearing, but, to exercise this right, you must specifically request a hearing in your appeal. If you do not request a hearing, you will waive your right to a hearing, the Commission will determine the outcome of your appeal based upon the written record (including the documentation you provide and any documentation in your case file), and you will receive no further notice until after the Commission decides your appeal.

FAILURE TO PAY FINE OR FILE APPEAL WITHIN 30 DAYS

If you do not timely file an appeal or pay the assessed fine within 30 days of this Notice, a default order will be entered against you and the Commission will take the steps provided by law to collect the fine, including:

- Referral to the CFO of the Department of Financial Services, if you are a salaried state officer or employee, for withholding of a portion of you salary until the fine is satisfied; or
- Referral to your agency's governing body for withholding of a portion of your salary until the fine is satisfied;
- Referral to a collection agency, which can seek garnishment of your wages; and/or
- An additional civil penalty, not limited by this automatic fine, may be imposed if your disclosure statement is filed more than 60 days late and a complaint is filed against you pursuant to Section 112.324, Florida Statutes.

DEFAULT FINAL ORDER

This matter comes before the Commission on Ethics for the failure of Felicia Stewart to pay the assessed fine. Pursuant to Section 112.3145(8)(g), Florida Statutes, the Florida Commission on Ethics is charged with assessing automatic fines of \$25 per day up to a maximum of \$1500 for persons who are required to file financial disclosure but who either file late, or not at all.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Felicia Stewart, Groveland, Planning and Zoning Board, was on the list of persons required to file a Statement of Financial Interests for the year 2018.
- 2. Pursuant to Section 112.3145(8)(g), Florida Statutes, Felicia Stewart was mailed a copy of the 2018 CE Form 1 no later than June 1, 2019, and was mailed a delinquency notice by certified mail no later than July 31, 2019. Additional attempts to contact Felicia Stewart were also made by Commission staff.
- 3. However, Felicia Stewart did not file a 2018 CE Form 1 by the designated due date. Felicia Stewart was sent a notice of payment due advising of the statutory rights to appeal or dispute the automatic fine in a hearing before the Commission if such appeal was received within 30 days of the notice of payment due. No timely appeal was received from Felicia Stewart.

- 4. More than 60 days have elapsed since the notice of payment due was transmitted without Felicia Stewart paying the fine.
- 5. On its own motion, the Commission voted to affirm that a fine in the amount of \$1500 has accrued in this matter.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 6. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this case, pursuant to Section 112.3145, Florida Statutes.
- 7. Felicia Stewart's failure to timely appeal the assessed fine constitutes a waiver of the entitlement to an appeal, pursuant to Rule 34-8.215(2), Florida Administrative Code.

ORDER

- 8. Pursuant to Section 112.3145(8) and 112.31455, Florida Statutes, the Commission on Ethics shall attempt to determine whether Felicia Stewart is currently a public officer or public employee receiving salary or wages from a governmental entity. If so, the matter will be referred to either the Chief Financial Officer for the State of Florida or the governing body for Groveland, as appropriate, for withholding of salary until the debt is satisfied.
- 9. If Felicia Stewart is no longer a public officer or employee, or if the Commission cannot determine filer's status, the matter will be referred to the Florida Department of Financial Services for collection or wage garnishment.

WHEREFORE, the automatic fine that Felicia Stewart accrued in the amount of \$1500 is affirmed. The fine shall be paid to the Florida Commission on Ethics within 30 days of the date this Default Final Order is entered. After that date, nonpayment will result in collection as provided for in Section 112.3145(8) and 112.31455, Florida Statutes.






