The following bills passed this session:

HB 7001 & HB 7003: These are the implementation bills for Amendment 12 regarding the post-officeholding and lobbying restrictions for elected officials including judges, as well as certain public employees. These provisions take effect December 31, 2022. As of the date of this memo, these bills are not yet before the Governor for signing.

HB 5003: This is the budget implementing bill. It contains the language that will pause electronic filing of the Form 6 and revert to paper forms for the remainder of 2022. Form 6 electronic filing will relaunch January 1, 2023 with Form 1 electronic filing pushed to January 1, 2024 according to the language of the bill. The relevant sections of the bill will be effective upon becoming law. It will expire July 1, 2023, which means we definitely need a bill next session addressing electronic filing. As of the date of this memo, the bill had not yet been provided to the Governor.
