SECOND ORDER ON REQUEST FOR EXTENSION

The Commission on Ethics has received a request for an extension of time to file a CE Form 1, Statement of Financial Interests, on behalf of the above-referenced individual who, as a member of the Planning and Zoning Board for Madison County, is required to file a 2021 CE Form 1. The request, which was timely submitted, asks for an additional time on behalf of Mr. Primm as he has been hospitalized and may not be released for up to three months. Based on the request, the Chair previously granted an initial 45-day extension through October 17, 2021. Given that Mr. Primm may still be hospitalized on that date, additional time may be needed for him to accurately complete the 2021 CE Form 1.

Section 112.3151, Florida Statutes, allows the Commission to grant, for good cause, an extension of time for filing disclosure. Good cause having been shown, the request is hereby GRANTED, and Mr. Primm shall have until and including December 31, 2022, to file his 2021 CE Form 1. *Should Mr. Primm require another extension, he should notify the Commission prior to the end of the December 31, 2022, extension period.*

ORDER ON REQUEST FOR EXTENSION BY THE CHAIR

The Commission on Ethics has received a request for an extension of time to file a CE Form 1, Statement of Financial Interests, on behalf of the above-referenced individual who, as a member of the Planning and Zoning Board for Madison County, is required to file a 2021 CE Form 1 no later than the expiration of the grace period, which is September 1, 2022. In the request, which was timely submitted on Mr. Primm's behalf, it is indicated that he has been hospitalized and may not be released for an extended period of time.

The Commission has delegated to its chair the authority to grant an extension of up to the statutory maximum of 45 days. Therefore, without a vote of the entire Commission, extensions granted for good cause pursuant to Section 112.3151, Florida Statutes, may not exceed 45 days.

Good cause having been shown, the request is hereby GRANTED, and Mr. Primm shall have an extension until, and including, October 17, 2022.¹
